

ially assessed in the amount of two-thirds thereof upon the lots and parcels of land abutting upon said improved street portions according to the extent of the respective frontage thereon by an equal rate per foot of such frontage, to be paid after completion of such work and within thirty (30) days after notice of assessment, in cash with no interest, of five equal annual installments, bearing annual interest at six (6%) per cent, payable annually.

(2) A meeting of the City Council of Fayetteville will be held at the City Hall of Fayetteville at 8:00 P.M. on the 25th day of April 1960, on the proposed improvement when all objections to the legality of making said proposed improvement shall be made in writing, signed in person or by Attorney, and filed with the Clerk of the City of Fayetteville at or before such time, and any such objections not so made will be waived.

(3) This RESOLUTION and ORDER shall be published once in THE FAYETTEVILLE OBSERVER, a newspaper published in the City of Fayetteville, ten (10) days before the time fixed for said meeting.

AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE CITY LIMITS

WHEREAS, notice was duly published in the Fayetteville Observer, a newspaper published in the City of Fayetteville, one time in the issue of March 24, 1960, that at the meeting of the City Council to be held in the City Hall at 8 P.M., Monday, April 11, 1960, there would be considered the annexation to the city all the territory hereinafter mentioned, as directed by said Council at its regular meeting on Monday, March 14, 1960, and as petitioned for by the owners of the property;

WHEREAS, there was no person present who objected to the annexation of the property in question;

WHEREAS, it is considered to be of the best interest of the City of Fayetteville and its inhabitants to annex the property and to include it within the municipality;

THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE DO ORDAIN:

That, in accordance with Chapter 725 of the session laws of 1947, all of that adjacent property to be annexed to, and made a part of, the City of Fayetteville, to wit;

BEGINNING at a point, the intersection of the southern margin of the right-of-way of the North Carolina Highway #59, with the western margin of Cain Road; and runs thence north 74 degrees 07 minutes 20 seconds east 533.27 feet to an iron stake; thence south 52 degrees 33 minutes 20 seconds east 91.36 feet to an iron stake; thence north 74 degrees 05 minutes 20 seconds east 205.11 feet to an iron stake; thence south 20 degrees 04 minutes 40 seconds east 324.83 feet to an iron stake; thence south 04 degrees 48 minutes 40 seconds east 296.63 feet to an iron stake; thence south 40 degrees 4 minutes 40 seconds east 330.60 feet to an iron stake; thence south 70 degrees 04 minutes 40 seconds east 270.60 feet to an iron stake; thence south 34 degrees 49 minutes east 860.19 feet to an iron stake; thence south 20 degrees 29 minutes east 118.45 feet to an iron stake; thence south 34 degrees 36 minutes west 249.90 feet to an iron stake; thence north 54 degrees 51 minutes west 1,902.81 feet to a point in the western margin of Cain Road; thence with the western margin of Cain Road north 2 degrees 6 minutes west 118.42 feet to a curvature in the said Cain Road; thence with the curve of Cain Road as it curves to the left on a radius of 3,001.24 feet for an arc distance of 341.06 feet to a point; thence continuing with the western margin of Cain Road, north 8 degrees 30 minutes 40 seconds west 451.53 feet to the point of beginning.
