This special meeting of the Council was called to act upon several bids which had been received and to hear a report from the Auditor.

City Manager Ray reported that the following bids were received on September 27, 1962 for the demolition of the Central School Building:

Following a brief discussion, Councilman Rhodes moved to accept the bid of W. T. HUNTLEY, JR., OF SOUTHERN PINES, NORTH CAROLINA, for \$4,790.00 with the stipulation that he meet all of the requirements outlined by the City Manager and City Attorney. The Council then heard a report from Mr. Phil Haigh of the firm of Haigh and vonRosenberg, CPA's, auditors for the City, on his firm's examination of the accounts of the City for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1962.

Mr. Haigh suggested further that the Council should be considering the installation of a system of accounting for fixed assets, although this was not a matter of grave concern or urgency at the present time.

After hearing the above report, Mayor Butler thanked Mr. Haigh and stated that the audit was very complete and comprehensive.
