

BEGINNING at a corner in the present city limits of the City of Fayetteville, said corner also being the southeast corner of Holly Springs, Part Six, as recorded in Plat Book 23, Page 57, Cumberland County Registry; thence North 7 degrees East 660' with the present corporate limits and the eastern margin of Holly Springs, Part Six to a point, said point being a corner in Holly Springs, Part Six; thence along a new line North 73 degrees 24' East 429'; thence South 14 degrees East 591.0'; thence North 83 degrees West 150.0'; thence South 14 degrees East 150.0'; thence North 80 degrees West 50'; thence South 14 degrees East 150.0' to a point in the present corporate limits of the City of Fayetteville; thence with the present corporate limits of the City of Fayetteville North 83 degrees 00' West 512.8' to the beginning and containing approximately 8 acres.

And that the Mayor cause an accurate map of such annexed territory, together with a copy of this ordinance duly certified, to be recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of Cumberland County and in the office of the Secretary of State.

This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its adoption.

Upon motion by Councilman Rhodes, seconded by Councilman Plummer, unanimous approval was given to a request by Mr. Lacy Godwin, a local realtor-rental agent, for permission to pave the front yard of a house located on the northeast corner of Fort Bragg Road and Park Street to provide off-street parking areas for office use.

Council again recognized Mr. Franklin Clark on a request for reconsideration of the condemnation proceedings regarding the construction of the electric transmission line being constructed by the Public Works Commission along Village Drive. The matter was discussed briefly, but Council took no action.

Council heard from Mr. Ben Huske III, Chairman of the City's Board of Adjustment who stated he wished to make an observation regarding the action just taken by the Council on Mr. Lacy Godwin's request for permission to pave the front yard of a house to provide off-street parking. Mr. Huske stated Council's improper action in this case would work a hardship on the Board of Adjustment and cause complications in the future.

Council recognized Mr. J. T. Squires speaking for himself and a Mr. Collins and a Mr. Adams on an action taken by the Council on June 24 to deny a petition for rezoning of an area on Raeford Road adjacent to Starhill and Wilborough Avenue from R6 and R10 RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT to P2 PROFESSIONAL DISTRICT. Mr. Squires stated that due to a misunderstanding about the date the matter would be brought before the Council for action, they were not present at the June 24 meeting and requested the Council to rescind its action of June 24 and requested a public hearing at which they might be present. Following some discussion; Councilman Holt moved that the Council's action of June 24th to deny the petition be rescinded and that a public hearing be advertised for August 26, 1963. Motion was seconded by Councilman Packer and carried unanimously.

Upon motion by Councilman Plummer, seconded by Councilman Holt, Council voted unanimously to refer a petition for the rezoning of an area on Tokay Drive from R10 Residential District to R6 Residential District, which had been denied by the Planning Board at its meeting of July 18, 1963, back to the Planning Board for rehearing.

Upon recommendation by City Manager Ray, the Council, on motion made by Councilman Rhodes, seconded by Councilman Plummer unanimously approved the following applicants to fill vacancies within the Police Department.

Acting on a request by Fire Chief Carl A. Cain, Mayor Clark reappointed Councilmen Plummer and Rhodes to the Firemens Relief Fund.

Councilman Rhodes moved for final approval of the Public Works Commission Budget for the fiscal year 1963 - 1964 in the amount of \$7,274,100.00. Motion was seconded by Councilman Packer and carried unanimously.

Upon motion by Councilman Packer, seconded by Councilman Plummer, the Council voted final approval for the City's budget for the fiscal year 1963 - 1964 by the unanimous adoption of the following Ordinance:

1963 - 1964 BUDGET ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE, NORTH CAROLINA:

Section I. The following amounts are hereby appropriated for the operation of City Government in its activities for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1963 and ending June 30, 1964, according to the following schedules:

General Fund.....	\$2,438,503.27
Recreation Fund.....	185,611.00
Cemetery Fund.....	34,577.00
Airport Fund.....	17,477.04
Debt Service Fund.....	746,673.75
Grand Total	\$3,422,842.06

Section II. It is estimated that the following revenue will be available during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1963 and ending on June 30, 1964 to meet the foregoing appropriations according to the following schedules:

General Fund.....	\$2,438,503.27
Recreation Fund.....	185,611.00
Cemetery Fund.....	34,577.00
Airport Fund.....	17,477.04
Debt Service Fund.....	746,673.75
Grand Total	\$3,422,842.06

Section III. There is hereby levied the following rate of tax on each one hundred dollars (\$100) valuation of taxable property as listed for taxes as of January 1, 1963 for the purposes of raising the revenue from current years property tax, as set forth in the foregoing estimates of revenue, and in order to finance the foregoing appropriations:

General Fund (for the general expense incident to the proper government of the city)	\$.95
Recreation Fund (for expenses of recreation and parks)	.10
Cemetery Fund (for expenses of Cemetery Department)	.02
Debt Service Fund (for the payment of interest and principal on outstanding debt)	.11
Total rate per \$100 valuation of taxable property	\$1.18

Section IV. There is hereby levied a poll tax of one dollar (\$1.00) on all male persons between the ages of 21 and 50 unless as provided by law for the purposes of raising the revenue from the current years poll tax as set forth in the foregoing estimate of revenue and in order to finance the foregoing appropriations.

Section V. There is hereby levied and assessed maximum license and privilege taxes as allowed cities with population in excess of 45,000 and less than 50,000 according to the 1960 census, under Schedule B of the State Revenue Act, except that in the case of a license or privilege tax in respect to any business, trade, profession, calling, occupation or act not mentioned in or prohibited to municipalities by said statute, but listed and taxed in the revenue ordinance levying, assessing, imposing, and defining the license and privilege taxes of the City of Fayetteville for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1950 and thereafter, as amended, such business, trade, profession, calling, occupation or act shall be taxed, licensed, and privileged as listed and defined in said ordinance, to the extent that the same is not in conflict with said statute, is hereby adopted by reference as specifically and fully as if set out herein.

Section VI. The attached document entitled "City of Fayetteville Preliminary Budget for fiscal year July 1, 1963 - 1964", is hereby adopted as the budget for such fiscal year for the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina.
