Discussion on Debris Contractor

Mr. Douglas Hewett, City Manager, provided an update and introduced the debris contractor, CrowderGulf. He advised the debris contractor was present as well as Ms. Jackie Tuckey, Environmental Services Public Relations, and Mr. James Rhodes, Environmental Services Superintendent. It was reported they currently have six crews and would have eight crews on November 15, 2016.

Mayor Robertson advised he will be meeting with the Chairman of the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners regarding a waiver on tipping fees and opening the landfill on Sundays.
